FAMILY SPIRIT PROGRAM


Family Spirit is a home visiting program for children 0-5 delivered by Indigenous paraprofessionals as an Indigenous solution to supporting caregivers during pregnancy and early childhood. For almost 30 years, it has been proven to promote positive parenting, mental wellbeing, and children's positive developmental trajectories. Family Spirit is designed to strengthen connections to family, culture, and heritage to help families thrive and promote healing within communities.

Through the Build a World of Play project, Family Spirit will be adapted for the unique contexts, strengths, and goals of global Indigenous communities, generating new relationships and shared learning across the world.
